It is notified for all concerned that the college is observing Communal Harmony Campaign week from 19.11.2022 to 25.11.2022 and flag day on 25th November, 2022.

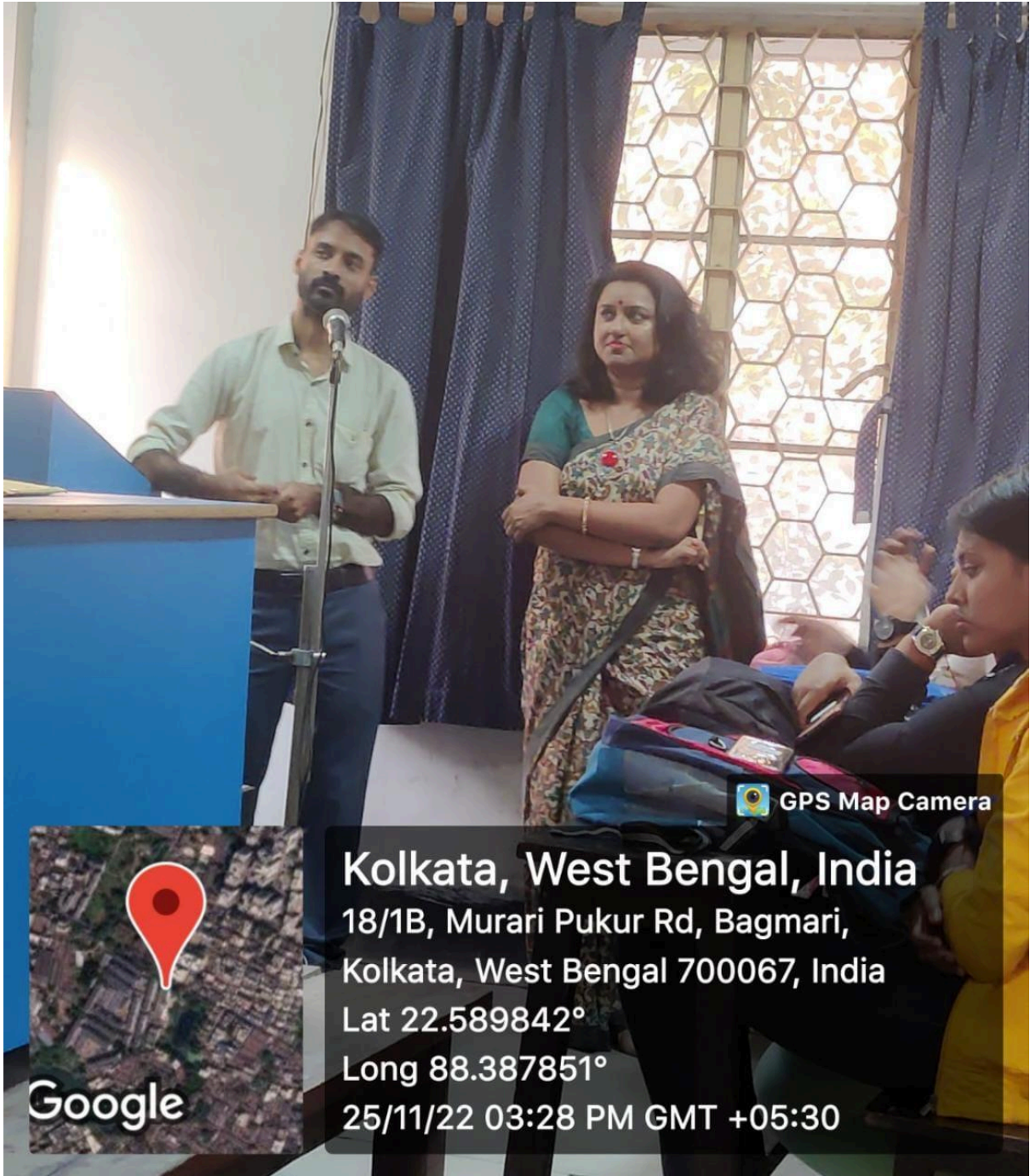
