The name of college is after Sir Gurudas Banerjee, First Indian Vice- Chancellor of The University of Calcutta. Again the College owes its legacy to Gurudas College of Commerce, the name by which it was previously known. This college is the outcome of the efforts of the teaching and non-teaching staff of Gurudas College and some social personalities of the locality.

1965:

Govt. of West Bengal permitted the establishment of Gurudas College of Commerce in 1965, with provision for using the infrastructure of Gurudas College in the evening shift.

21 August 1968:

The college was granted affiliation by Calcutta University. The date being followed as the foundation day of the college. The college was

1998:

During the period from 1984 to 1998 a number of initiatives and affirmative actions were taken to set the college on the track of expansion. The extension of affiliation to teach B. Com. at honours level was granted in 1998. .

06.01. 2001:

The college was shifted to its own premise at its present address with the construction of only the ground floor of the college on 06.01.2001. The present-day four storied building has been completed in phases.

It has been gradually converted to multi-faculty, day-shift, co-education College and renamed from Gurudas College of Commerce to **Sir Gurudas Mahavidyalaya**.

The college currently runs 3 (three) programs in the Commerce stream, 7 (seven) programs in the Humanities stream and 5 (five) programs in the science stream.

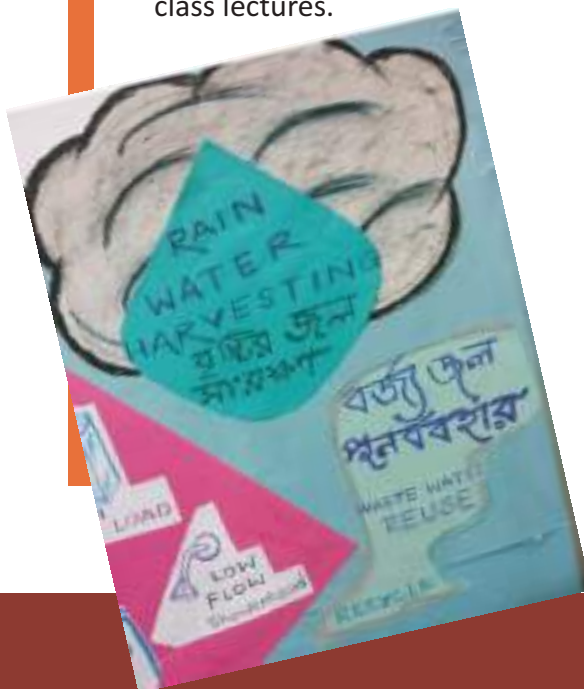
ACREDITATION

Student's Creation of Poster for World Environment Day 2022

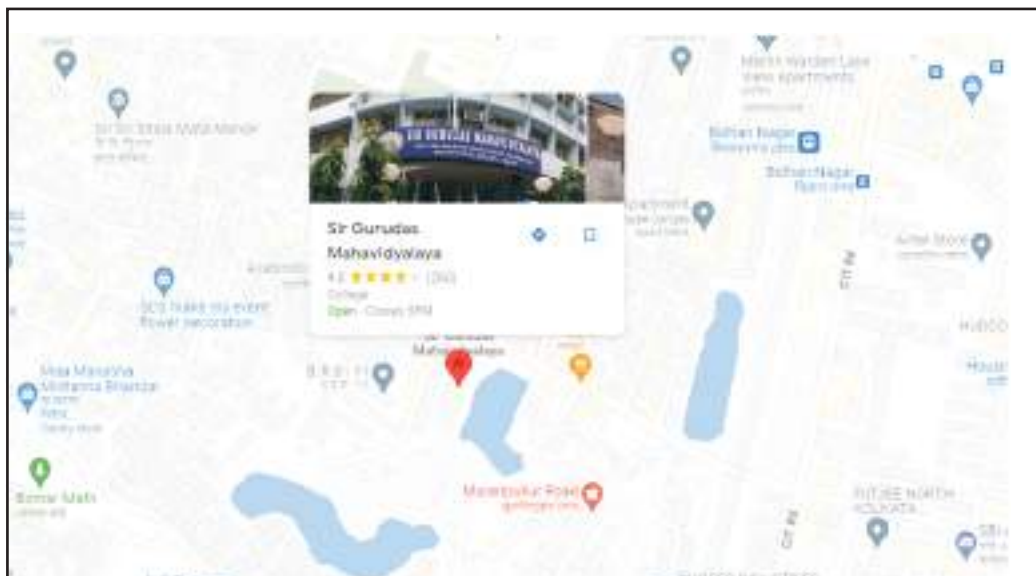

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

1. (a) A student who has passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) or its equivalent Examination is eligible to seek admission to the 1st year of the B.A./B.Sc. (Single-Major) Course of Studies provided the candidate has also passed in English having full marks not being **less than 100 and fulfills the conditions as laid down in clause 5, 10, 11 and 12 (Refer -CSR /05/2023).**

However, no student shall be allowed to take admission after a lapse of more than 3 years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination.

(Explanation: The year of admission shall not be taken into account while calculating three years from the year of passing the previous qualifying Examination).

(b) Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination or its equivalent from the All India Boards/Councils (i.e. CBSE, ISC and National Institute of Open Schooling) need not require to submit the Migration Certificate for getting Registration under this University.

For the purpose of determining eligibility for admission to the B.A./B.Sc./ (Single-Major) Courses, aggregate marks shall be calculated by adding the marks in top-four subjects in order of marks secured by a student. However, marks in compulsory Environmental Education/Studies shall not be taken into account for calculation of aggregate marks. However, if the subject “Environmental Science” is studied as an elective subject of 100 marks, it may be taken into account for the purpose of determining the aggregate marks.

Guidelines on 4 YEAR B.A./B.Sc. (Honours with or Without Research under CCF, 2022)

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- (a) A student taking up Major Course in a subject must have obtained:
- i. A minimum of 50% marks in the aggregate and 45% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination.
Or
 - ii. 55% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination.
Or
 - iii. 50% marks in the aggregate when the student has not studied the subject in his/her previous qualifying examination provided all other clauses are satisfied.
- (b) Students belonging to Reserved Categories taking up Major Course f Study must have obtained a minimum of 40% marks in the aggregate or 40% marks in the subject or related subjects at the previous qualifying examination, as the case may be.

Seat reservation for admission in the first year class of four-year (eight semesters) degree courses of studies shall be guided by the West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission), Act, 2013 and the West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Rules, 2014 and Memorandum No. 339-Edn (CS)/OM-74L/2023, dt. 26.05.2023.

(Multi disciplinary) Course of Studies provided the student has also passed in English having full marks not being less than 100 and fulfills the conditions as laid down in clause 5, 10, 11 and 12 (Ref-CSR/04/2023).

Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Vocational examination conducted by the West Bengal State Council of Vocational Education and Training shall be eligible to seek admission to the B.A. (Multi disciplinary) 1st year Course of Studies taking the subjects under Humanities Discipline only.

However, no student shall be allowed admission after a lapse of more than 3 years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination.

(Explanation: The year of admission shall not be taken into account while calculating three years from the year of passing the previous qualifying Examination).

Duration

The Four-year B.Com.Honours/ Honours with Research Programme:

shall be for a minimum duration of eight (08) (with an exit option after completion of 2nd (certificate)/ 4th/(Diploma)/6th semester (Degree) consecutive semesters of six months each.

Three-year B,Com. Programme:

shall be for a duration of six (6) (with an exit option after completion of 2nd/4th semester) consecutive semesters of six months each.

Eligibility Criteria

1. (a)

A candidate who has passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) or its equivalent Examination is eligible to seek admission to the 1st year of the Four-Year B.Com.(Honors or Honours with Research) / Three-Year B.Com Degree Course of Studies provided he/she has also passed in English having full marks not being less than 100 and fulfills the conditions as laid down in clause 5, 10, 11 and 12 (Refer- CSR/06/2023)

Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Vocational Examination in Business and Commerce conducted by the West Bengal State Council of Vocational Education and Training shall be eligible to seek admission to the first year of the three-year B.Com. course of studies under this University.

However, no candidate shall be allowed to take admission after a lapse of more than 3 years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination.

(Explanation: The year of admission shall not be taken into account while calculating three years from the year of passing the previous qualifying Examination).

Student who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination or its equivalent from the All India Boards/Councils (i.e. CBSE, ISC and National Institute of Open Schooling) need not be required to submit the Migration Certificate for getting Registration under this University.

For the purpose of determining eligibility for admission to the Four-Year B.Com.(Honours or Honours with Research) / Three-Year B.Com. Degree Courses, aggregate marks shall be by adding the marks in top-four subjects in order of marks secured by a candidate. However, marks in compulsory Environmental Education / Studies shall not be taken into account for calculation of aggregate marks. However, if the subject “Environment Science“ is studied as an elective subject of 100 marks, it may be taken into account for determining the aggregate marks.

A student taking up Four-Year B.Com. Honours or Honours with Research Course of study in a subject must have obtained:

i. A minimum of 50% marks in the aggregate and 45% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination.

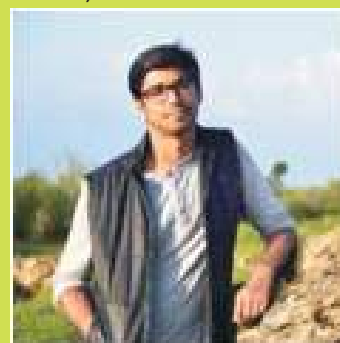


Department of Mathematics
